MRI UPDATE

Because of your generous investment, the plans to bring an MRI to GBGH are moving along with great efficiency! We are thrilled to share that the team has selected the Magnetom Sola 1.5T as the MRI machine that will be purchased for GBGH.

The sketches have been drawn for the 2,000 square foot addition to the building, and all detailed architectural and mechanical plans have been submitted to the Ministry of Health Capital Branch for approval.

In the meantime, the team is working on selecting a contractor for the project and the construction fence was installed in December, to prepare the space for work to begin in Spring of 2024.

These developments are possible because our community has come together, and succeeded in raising more than \$2-million in less than 12 months for this project.




Happy New Year to all and as we are now enjoying the first months of 2024, I want to briefly highlight one of our hospital's biggest achievements of 2023. In November, GBGH underwent a voluntary evaluation known as Accreditation which occurs every four years. During the Accreditation survey, our hospital was evaluated based on approximately 2,000 quality and safety standards. It was a very successful process for GBGH and I could not be more proud of the result. We achieved a score of more than 99%, resulting in our hospital being granted the highest honour possible - Accredited with Exemplary Standing. This accomplishment would not have been possible without the dedication and attention to detail of the GBGH team. Their efforts made this survey such a resounding success!

We are proud of this outcome because it is an affirmation of the excellent standard of care we provide at GBGH. Regardless of our Accreditation result, we never stop looking at ways to be better for our community.

One of the most urgent issues our hospital faces is the overwhelming number of acute mental health visits to our Emergency Department. Last year, patients in mental health crisis visited our ED nearly 1,700 times, and some of those patients had to wait for more than 100 hours before being transferred to another facility in our region with an appropriate mental health bed.

We can improve these alarming statistics by bringing an acute mental health and outpatient program to our hospital. This will alleviate some burden across the region and serve our local community who needs the support. Wait times for a mental health bed in Simcoe Muskoka are already the second longest in the province, mental health visits continue to increase in volumes and prevalence. We know mental health patient days far exceed the provincial average of 89 days per 1,000 residents. For example, in Penetanguishene, the patient days are 297, with Midland at 212 days.



So how can we be part of the solution? Last fall, GBGH submitted the third stage of a nine-stage process to the Ministry of Health. This submission included detailed plans for our proposed program which has 24 acute inpatient beds (16 adult, 8 geriatric). It also includes a partial hospitalization program and an outpatient program to help patients transition back to the community, as well as avoid being admitted to the hospital in the first place. These programs will be housed in a 48,400 square foot addition to the existing hospital. This is where you - our community - will play an essential role in helping us build this program. Together, we can improve access to mental health services in our community. Thank you for continuing to partner with us as we strive to Make Excellent Care Personal.

Funds raised this year will help to bring an MRI machine to GBGH, a vital piece of equipment needed in our community. BAYPORT LODGE

From June 23 to August 11, 2023, Bayport Lodge and its members, matched donations to the GBGH Foundation's MRI Fund, up to a total of \$50,000. Shared only through local media and word of mouth, the challenge resonated with the community and inspired local businesses, individuals and another local masonic group to donate \$50,300 in just 50 days.





SAMANTHA TOWNES

What is your role at GBGH?

As Manager of Critical Care & Allied Health, my role is to support my teams in day-to-day operations, as well as lead any projects or quality initiatives that we identify both as a group and corporately. We are regularly evaluating that the care we provide is of the upmost quality and that our actions are aligned with our strategic goals and values.

What is one thing you love about your role?

The team! I have worked very closely with the Critical Care team since I started at GBGH, and they continue to impress me with their passion, dedication and resilience. All of my team members are so dedicated to their respectful professions, and it is really a privilege to be able to work alongside them.

Tell us a bit about our ICU?

Our ICU is designated a Level 3 Basic ICU, is the second highest designation an ICU can receive in Ontario with the exception of specialty units. Our team cares for some of the most complex and acutely ill patients in our region in our 6-bed unit, as well up to 10 medical/surgical patient's cardiac activity through our telemetry monitoring system.

While we have invested in the technology to ensure excellent care for our patients, the patient rooms haven't been updated since the hospital was built in 1976. One of the biggest challenges we face are the clunky, outdated doors to each room, which get stuck, have broken blinds and do not give the team full visibility to those in our care.



Sounds like you need new doors! How would this investment support excellent care in the ICU?

Modern ICU doors offer complete visibility from floor to ceiling, so that a nurse/team member can check on patients at a glance. Our nurses can identify a change in a patient's condition based on many factors, whether it be through the bedside monitoring system, physical appearance, medications infusing, right down to making sure tubes and lines are in place. Having the room in full visibility is critical, while supporting their privacy and space when appropriate.

When doors are stuck or defective, it can be very challenging to move the patient bed or gain access to the room in a hurry. New doors will slide much more effectively, protecting our nurses from injury and ensuring their focus is on caring for patients.


How can the community help?

We have approval from leadership to install new ICU doors, but we need the funding to pay for them. We have seven doors to replace, at a cost of approximately \$10,000 each. The new doors will help our team care for you, and bring our ICU rooms from the 70s into the 21st century!

Ambulatory Care Cost: \$34,000

Thanks to incredible support on Giving Tuesday, our Ambulatory Care team has a new power procedure table and new exam lights for the Lumps & Bumps clinic! The table ensures patients are comfortable during their procedures, and the lights provide clear, precise illumination, making every operation more accurate and efficient.



X-Ray Rooms Cost: \$1.15 Million

Our X-ray rooms have been upgraded and now include technology that provides better quality images, with much less radiation, in a more comfortable and refreshed environment. The new equipment is motorized and automated, so it adjusts easily to capture the best image of every size and shape of patient.



Pharmacy Fridge & Freezer

Cost: \$25,000

Our Pharmacy Team now has proper storage for hundreds of medications. Injectable medications are now safely stored – frozen or chilled – ensuring their immediate availability for any patient in need, and proper storage to prevent waste.



Ultrasound Cost: \$187,000

Having a third, modern ultrasound at GBGH is critical for providing the best imaging so that our radiologists can deliver clear and accurate results for 10,000 patients every year. This will improve wait times for this important imaging, ensuring fast access to excellent care for everyone in our community.
